Implementing the Community Plan—new working groups open

Having finalised the community plan last year, the Community Planning group's focus is now on implementation of the many actions that the community raised. To help in this process, we will be establishing a number of topic-based working groups.

Planning & Services Working Group

The first of the working groups arising from the Lyonville Community Plan—the Planning and Services working group. The group will be addressing the actions arising from the plan, including road safety (speed limits, road signage etc), telecommunications and power supply interruptions. So far, Council has been contacted regarding advice on the road safety issues and Powercorp has been contacted to ask why we have so many power cuts. Their response was that as we are in a bushfire-prone area, the power is automatically turned off when there is a line issue to prevent power-line caused fires and it then takes a while to find the problem and fix it. Thanks to the group members for taking on these issues

Our Village Look & Feel Working Group

The next group to commence is the 'Our Village Look & Feel' working group. If you love our township and would like to help keep Lyonville fresh and beautiful, we'd love you to join the 'Our Village Look and Feel' working group. The group will work on the actions identified in the Lyonville Community Plan, which include exploring development of local assets such as the springs, old school, local walking tracks, the rail trail, and developing new events that highlight Lyonville attractions. A few recent snippets from the Hall Committee:

- We hope to get the exterior of the hall painted before winter and are awaiting advice from the contractor on timing.
- We have submitted plans to Council to erect a roof over the area between the hall and the toilet block to provide shelter for events.
- We plan to build a woodshed as an extension to the toilet block on the south side to store wood for the pizza oven. Once this is up and stocked with free wood supplied by Council, it will make it easier for folk to use the pizza oven.
- The community dinner held on 5 December was a great success, with around 30 people attending.
- The book exchange is up and running on the stage at the hall with an eclectic mix of books filling the shelf. Do visit!
