Lyonville Community Planning Update

Community Planning Group

The Community Planning Group has a new member, Anthony Zaspel, who joins Greg Jones, Shelley Bowen, Jordan Koster and Vicki Jackson to oversee the implementation of our community plan. The next step for the planning group is to apply to become an incorporated body. This will enable us to hold a bank account and to apply for grants and funding for projects relating to the plan.

Implementing the Community Plan-new working groups open Having finalised the community plan last year, the Community Planning group's focus is now on im-plementation of the many actions that the community raised. To help in this process, we are establishing a number of topic-based working groups.

Planning & Services Working Group

This group has written to Council to commence a review of road safety on the Daylesford- Trentham road and within the township. The group is also liaising with Powercor to understand the issues causing the frequent power outages and what options are available to ensure a more reliable service.

Our Village Look & Feel Working Group

This group met for the first time in February and agreed to work on three goals initially: opportunities for roadside tree planting to enhance the township; sourcing more visible and pleasing township signage on the main road at each end of the township; applying to VicTrack, who own the land around the Lyonville Station, to see if we can lease all or part of the land for use as community assets. The vacant land could be used as a community park and the station building could be used as an arts venue, information centre and event space. The station and surrounding land is currently leased but we understand that the lease may be up for review soon. The next meeting of this group in on 23 March at 7pm at the hall-please come along if you want to join us, or if this reaches you too late, contact Vic-ki on 0438178150 for more information.

History Art & Culture Working Group

The first meeting of this group will be on Wednesday 30 March at 7pm in the hall. This group will explore and document the history of Lyonville, highlight the many artists in the township, and create ceremonies, events and memorials to celebrate our history and culture. A few snippets from the Hall Committee:

- Exterior painting of the hall will commence in the next few weeks
- Planning approval for the covered area near the pizza oven has stalled due to lack of planning staff at Council. We hope to get approval soon
- The woodshed is under construction and should be ready for stacking at the working bee on 3 April.
- Two picnic tables have been installed in the hall grounds for use by visitors and at the café.
- We are negotiating with an artist to commission an historical mural along the corrugated iron fence on the south of the hall grounds.
- Working bee to be held on 3 April at 10am 12 noon.
